

Music and Sound Technician - Job Description

Main Tasks and Responsibilities

- Managing and maintaining the music facilities computer suites, midi keyboards, instrument stock, amplifiers, microphones, leads, etc.
- Assisting in KS3 (Year 7-9), KS4 (GCSE) and KS5 (A Level) lessons through technical support as well as working with pupils on lesson tasks
- Recording and collating GCSE / A Level coursework ready for submission
- Set up, live mixing and recording of all concerts usually one per week
- Running a KS3 Music Technology club
- Aiding students in the use of amplification and recording equipment
- Taking part in, supporting and leading extra-curricular activities, where applicable
- Attending a number of residential and day trips throughout the year
- Supporting the teaching and support staff with the day-to-day running of the music department
- There is scope for the music and sound technician to develop other projects and initiatives. Previous technicians have started new ensembles, set up sound recording clubs, developed the music archives, been responsible for the department's social media, and pioneered a music festival.
