Dear Candidate

We are delighted that you are interested in working with Wandle Learning Trust (WLT).

WLT is a family of four academies in south London comprising a secondary school, Chestnut Grove Academy, and three primary schools, Chesterton Primary School, Paxton Academy and Ravenstone Primary School. We are a cross phase Trust covering all ages from Nursery to post 16. Uniquely our Trust is also home to Maths, English and Teaching School Hubs, which sit within Wandle Learning Partnership, our teacher and curriculum development arm. Market-leading phonics programme Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised was also developed by our Trust in collaboration with Little Sutton Primary School and is managed from our offices in south London.

Pupil performance is strong across all schools with all primaries outperforming national averages at Key Stage 2. At Chestnut Grove, 41% of all Key Stage 4 entries were graded 7-9 compared with a national average of 25%. Seventy three per cent of students were entered for the English Baccalaureate compared with a national average of just 40%. In the Sixth Form the success continued with 29% of all entries graded A*/A and 75% graded A*- C.

As well as supporting school improvement across our region and the country, Wandle Learning Partnership presents all Trust staff with meaningful, sectorleading opportunities to develop subject knowledge and pedagogy. We believe in 'growing our own' and have pathways for all levels of staff and leadership to further their careers within Trust schools.

Collectively all facets of our organisation are united in the belief that there is no more important role than making a positive difference to children's lives. As the result of attending an academy within the Trust, our aim is that every child and young person will be inspired and empowered by their education. Inspired to build a purposeful and fulfilling life and empowered to make a valuable contribution to the world around them. As a Trust we believe in Educating for life, ensuring that children and young people are prepared for the next stage of their education, employment or training. Each school is aiming to achieve an outstanding judgement from OFSTED at the earliest appropriate point and be contributing to delivering world-class education within the Trust.

Ravenstone Primary School

Ravenstone Primary is a thriving twoform entry school in the heart of Balham, south London. Ravenstone is an inclusive school and we are determined that all pupils, of all abilities, get the high quality of education they deserve.

As well as ensuring inclusive provision within each of our classrooms, we offer places for up to 16 children on the autistic spectrum in our specialist hub, The Hive.

High quality teaching in Reading, Writing and Mathematics underpins everything that we do so that children get the best possible start to their education journey.

The Ravenstone entitlement is an offer to every child in the school, which includes at least one external trip, one inspirational internal visit and a curriculum-themed day every term. Sport is one of the cornerstones of the school's identity and an area in which pupils particularly excel. We have a full-time dedicated sports teacher and a part time dance teacher and regularly excels in inter-school competitions.


Wandle English Hub

Working with schools in 16 London boroughs supporting schools to achieve excellence in early literacy teaching.

Our support includes:

- Showcase events in teaching phonics, language and a love of reading
- Support to develop an action plan
- A reading audit in eligible schools
- Funding for training and resources
- Six days of support from a Literacy Specialist
- A CPD programme to support early language development and reading for pleasure open to all schools in the EH region

Our Teaching School Hub provides high quality professional development to teachers at all stages of their careers within the London Boroughs of Wandsworth, Kingston-Upon-Thames, Merton and Richmond-Upon-Thames.

It is the focal point for teacher development in our region providing a golden thread of teacher professional development from ITT to Headship and working with Leading Provider UCL. We play a core role in the provision of ITT, ECF, NPQ, CPD and Appropriate Body Services. Our Hub also works closely with longstanding partners and schools, and is continuing to build links with many more schools and teacher development partners across the region.

Working in partnership with Little Sutton Primary School and other phonics and early reading experts.

Our complete SSP has been built around the update (Letters and Sounds improving rates of progress 2021) and draws on our own schools' excellent practice Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised also draws on the latest research into how children learn best; how to ensure learning stays in children's long -term memory and how best to enable children to apply their learning to become highly competent readers.

Little Wandle is a not-for-profit organisation with a focus on making membership both affordable and great value for money. Our programme is now being used to teach children to learn and love to read in more than 4,500 schools in England and internationally. We have also have partnered with Collins Big Cat to produce decodable books exactly matched to the programme, as well as a range of classroom resources to support teachers in delivering effective phonics.
